Tips for Helping with Maths at Home



- Be positive about maths!
- Let your child know that **everyone** can learn maths and that **you** think maths is important and fun.
- Spend the time: Practise the Basic Facts.
- Show your child how you use numbers and maths, everywhere, any time.
- Point out the ways in which different family members use maths in their jobs.
- Praise your child when he/she makes an effort, and share in the excitement when he / she solves a problem or understands something for the first time.
- Encourage your child to be persistent if a problem seems difficult.
- Make maths part of your child's day.
- Ask questions about how their maths learning went that day? What are they learning?
- Include your child in everyday activities that involve maths – making purchases, measuring ingredients, calculating time, map reading, reading calendars, weather maps and graphs in newspapers.

- Play games and do puzzles with your child.
- Create maths problems with your child for fun.
- In addition to maths tools, such as a ruler and a calculator, use household objects, such as measuring cups and containers of various shapes and sizes.
- Encourage your child to give explanations.
- When your child is trying to solve a problem, ask what he or she is thinking. If your child seems puzzled, ask him or her to tell you what doesn't make sense. (Talking about their ideas and how they reach solutions helps children learn to reason mathematically.)
- Suggest that your child act out a problem to solve it. Have your child show how he /she reached a conclusion by drawing pictures and moving objects as well as by using words.
- Treat errors as opportunities to help your child learn something new. Encourage your child to take risks.

Show an interest, encourage and have high expectations that your child will succeed in mathematics.

MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

The Board met during the last week of term 3 and were proud to hear more glowing reports regarding school standards, abilities and achievements.

Earlier in term 3 the National Monitoring Study of Student Achievement (NMSSA) studied a group of our year 4 learners and reported them to be positive and enthusiastic. In particular their knowledge of Te Reo was better than compared to some other schools year 8 learners. In addition our recent ERO report acknowledged our strength of procedure, structure and results by providing a 4-5 year gap before the next review; this is unique to our school as other new build schools around the country get 1 to 3 year reviews. Our Enviroschools programme was also acknowledged by a visit from Dr Nic Smith and other dignitaries, where our Enviroteam led the discussion on how our school actions positive environmental practises. This in turn led to letters from various dignitaries congratulating Waitākiri School, articles in the Education Gazette and Parliament News. So all in all a pretty stellar effort from the leadership team, staff and pupils.

The Board also reviewed Neill's Principals Appraisal Report and continue to be appreciative of the attributes, character and energy with which Neill leads our school. Our learners were also appreciative of Neill; in particular comments about his soccer skills and sense of humour were amusing. Neill's recent trip to Thailand with leaders of schools in the Otākaro Cluster went extremely well. Not only did this provide a platform to showcase why our school would be appealing for Thai students but was another great opportunity for the principals in our cluster to collaborate and further enhance their professional relationship and provide some continuity between local schools to assist our learners when moving on after year 6. We look forward to the possibility of hosting students from another culture at our school.

A few housekeeping issues involved discussions regarding uniform function, warmth, appearance and durability. We agree that our uniform looks smart, is priced well, admittedly gets worn in rather heavily by it's users and given that it gets worn most days of the year, we are happy with its performance. Our uniform items are comparative to other primary schools and we are satisfied that there are options for a variety of weather and circumstances.

Our Health and Safety procedures are always being reviewed and monitored to ensure we provide a safe environment for everyone at our school. We are confident that all possible steps are being implemented.

Uniform Standards Reminder

We have a smart new uniform that reflects our REAL CHOICES values. Students are expected and encouraged to take pride wearing their uniform and in their general appearance.

Shoes

- Black shoes or sandals only (no coloured soles or strapping/laces).

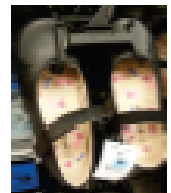


Socks and tights

- Black or white plain ankle or knee length socks (no colours or motifs on the socks) or plain black tights.

School Bucket Hat

- School Bucket Hats are compulsory for term 1 and term 4



Jewellery and piercings

- No jewellery is to be worn, other than a watch and ear studs (no hoops/dangling earrings).
- Nose and tongue piercings are not permitted.
- Any taonga or religious medals can be worn but must be kept tucked under clothing.

Hair and hair accessories

- Hair should be brushed and be kept neat and tidy, away from the face, especially the eyes.
- If hair is shoulder length, it must be tied back in a tidy manner by a hair tie or similar.
- Hair accessories need to be kept to hair colour or school colours (black or blue). Affordable hair ties and clips are available at your local supermarket.
- No sparkly, multi coloured or elaborate hair accessories are to be worn.
- Extremes in hair styles such as spikes, mohawks, patterns, messages or numbers shaved into the hair are discouraged.
- Excessive amounts of wax or gel are discouraged.
- Hair style must allow wearing of the school sun hat in Terms 1 and 4.
- Hair dye is permitted provided the colour is natural colourings (and a single colour only).

Please note: If students arrive at school with inappropriate hair styles, parents/caregivers will be contacted by the Principal or Deputy Principal to arrange for the necessary changes to be made.

Fingernail polish and tattoos

- Fingernail polish must not be worn, and tattoos are not acceptable.

Underwear

- Thermals and leggings/bike shorts are not permitted to be seen under the school uniform. If they are worn, they must be the same length as the uniform item. eg, short sleeved polo with short sleeved thermal.

The policies and procedures are tailored to our school, and the school supplies specific information such as our charter, and procedures for behaviour management, reporting to parents, etc.

Policies are monitored by SchoolDocs and updated, modified, or created in response to changes in legislation, significant events, Ministry guidelines, reviews/requests from schools, and regular reviewing from the SchoolDocs team. Our board of trustees has the opportunity to view changes and additions and comment on them before they are implemented. This is to advise you that there are two policies up for review, "*Education Outside the Classroom*" & "*Sun Protection*".
